


Binoculars*

Educational Intentions (Suggestions):

Create binoculars and look at objects off with it.

Age Group:

Multiage

Required Materials:

- Three rolls of toilet paper per child or one roll of paper towel per child
- Stickers
- Felts
- Paint
- Paint brushes
- Punches
- String
- Scissors

Binoculars

Approach

- 1. If the student has brought a paper towel roll, cut the roll in two equal parts and keep a small tip to staple the rolls together.
- 2. Students decorate their tubes with paint, markers, stickers, etc.
- 3. With a wide end of roll, staple the tubes together in the center.
- 4. Once dry, perforate and add a cord so students can have it on their wrists or around their necks.
